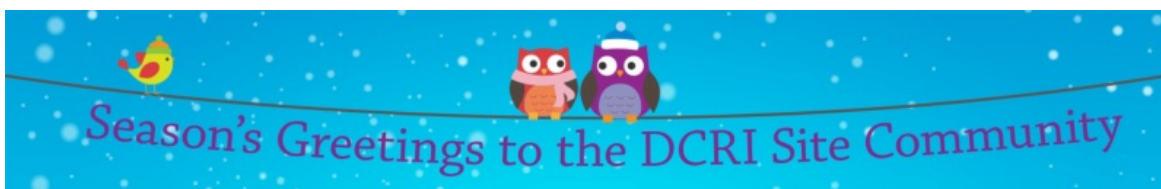

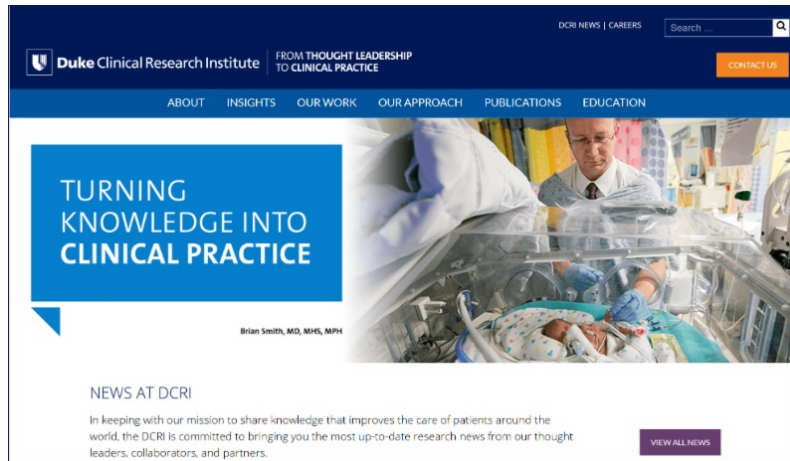

[Kristin Newby, MD](#), and [Jennifer Rymer, MD](#), discuss reasons behind medication non-adherence and potential ways to lower related readmission rates. Education, insurance, medication cost, and post-discharge follow-up timing are among the issues addressed. They reference several studies that seek greater insights into adherence and non-adherence, including the [ARTEMIS multi-center trial](#) of which Duke is a part. They also discuss a promising new interactive teaching tool developed at Duke to help patients understand and manage their medication.

### Interventional Cardiology Podcast Series

**TAVR Outcomes for Low- to Intermediate-Risk Patients with Severe Atherosclerosis. Is transcatheter or surgical aortic-valve replacement more advantageous for low- to intermediate-risk patients?**

[J. Kevin Harrison, MD](#), and [Jennifer A Rymer, MD](#), discuss the advances of transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) as an alternative to open surgery. Among other studies, they cite the [Partner 2 randomized trial](#) comparing transcatheter and open surgery outcomes in 2000 patients. They also discuss the advances in TAVR technologies and the implications for patients with severe atherosclerosis. This is the
